and I will have to miss the odd game as I do work some weekends in my capacity as a Training Analyst working with the British Army but I am sure this will not be a problem.



I have a few ideas and they are elsewhere in this newsletter. I hope to push a newsletter out every two or three of months. Clearly, with social media as it is, these types of thing are often forgotten but I hope to be able to find enough material to fill them. I thought I would tell you all a little about myself. I was voted onto the committee some time ago but work took me abroad last year to Jordan. This was a great opportunity but as an Evertonian not ideal as I explain later. I have been back in the UK since early December, arriving the night before the Man City game which in my absence both

Why Everton?

I have been an Evertonian for ever I think, well less about 75 minutes of the 1966 Cup Final.

I can honestly say it is because I can remember that in 1966 my parents, who were both Police Officers were able to afford to rent a television from Radio Rentals in Tiverton. Father was now a Detective Constable and the extra guinea a week paid for this luxury.

So there I was on May 14th 1966 happily playing football on the green outside of the Police House we lived in when I was ordered in by pater.

"Come and watch this game of football...it's the FA Cup Final". Begrudgingly I sat crossed legged in front of the wooden box with a glass front waiting for something to happen. It was perched rather precariously on four very wobbly legs and as I waited for it to warm up, I suggested that I would rather be out in the sunshine but decided better of it after the look father gave me!

Ten minutes later and still waiting for it to warm up I could sense that Williams senior was irritated somewhat, and was not overly surprised when he gave it a rather hard smack to the side. To be truthful the only surprise was he hit it rather harder than the ones he seemed to save for me...but it worked and there it was, a grainy black and white picture. Not quite sure how the wobbly legs never collapsed with the smack he gave it but there was now a picture of Wembley Stadium, that was sort of beginning to become fairly clear and it seemed to get better as the valves warmed up or something.



It looked like it was the all Whites against the Black and Whites (For those watching in Black and White the Pink ball is the one next to the Blue Ball...!). The teams appeared on the screen and lined up as follows:

Then we lost the picture again, another hefty smack to the side of the television coupled with a rather loud shout which included words that I had not heard before but they seemed to be aimed at some chap who worked for Radio Rentals!

This rather frightening outburst did work though and the picture was back and Everton have scored themselves during the unplanned interlude. Then the unthinkable as Everton scored again which caused father to explode with delight...unfortunately frightening mother to death and causing her to drop a stitch in the new tank top she was knitting...I heard that word again....this time directed at the ol' fella!

Then some bloke ran on the pitch and as it was all fantastically explained in his own very special way by Kenneth Wolstenholme the chap managed to avoid the chasing officers of the law on his way to try and kiss Gordon West. Accompanied by shouts of encouragement from my father the pursuing Police officers eventually rugby tackled the chap on the edge of the box and led him away rather un-ceremoniously.

Sadly, father's Police outlook on life suggested that this chap had committed the most hideous of crimes and deserved to be sent to Dartmoor on bread and water. This was surprising as I thought this was a place for kids as I was always being threatened to be sent there, especially when I refused to eat cabbage or something equally disgusting!

Anyway off out I went and announced to the rest of the gang that I supported Everton and my favorite player was Mike Treble Cock which the older boys found funny....and then some git told my ol' fella who hit me on the side of the head as if I was a Radio Rental TV...I wobbled and my two legs gave way....when I woke up I was wearing a rather nice Blue and White Tank top!!
